INCOMING FRESHMEN

Physical & Vaccination Requirements

A reminder that all incoming Freshmen MUST have a school physical and submit the completed form to the high school office. The school physical form is available at the IWHS web site (www.illiniwest.org) or in most doctors' offices. The school physical form may also be used as a sports physical for Freshmen athletes.

Students must also receive a Td booster ten years after their last Td booster. This usually occurs during a student's Freshman or Sophomore year. Please check with your health care provider or call the high school office to determine when your student must receive their booster.

The Hancock County Health Department offers school physicals by appointment for a cost of \$25.00. The booster shot is also available at a cost of \$10.00. Appointments can be made by calling 357-2171. These services can also be obtained from your usual health care provider.

A reminder that each athlete must have a current sports physical in order to participate in any high school sport. A sports physical is good for only one year from the date of the exam. Several area clinics are offering reduced rates for sports physical. These include:

- Hamilton-Warsaw Clinic During the months of June, July, and August the Clinic will be offering discounts on student physicals. Sports Physicals will be \$10.00 and the School Physicals, which all students entering 5th and 9th grades will need, are \$32.00. All money is donated back to the Student's School. Second Annual Autism Awareness Week - By Rhonda Miller


